Members of the committee solicit artist applications, create and track contracts and artist information, hang the show in the Galleria display cases in the library and create signs to go with the shows. This year for the first time we were able to give a \$100 cash award for Best of Shows at the end of 2016 thanks to a donation from First Western Trust. 

THE SORTING PLACE

The Sorting Place is an on-going operation of Friends, employing dozens of volunteers. This year, we boxed and sent 35,500 books to the Spring Sale, and 54,000 to the Fall Sale. We have a dedicated group of volunteers who come in Tuesdays and Wednesdays to sort and pack books. A smaller group picks up books from the Book Lovers and Book Haven bookstores and from the library. Others come in on off days to empty the book bins, and on Sundays to put out the recycling bins. We also continue to tweak the categories and sorting rules, trying to find the right mix of having enough selection without taking books that are out of date, old, damaged, or otherwise unsalable. There is a constant tug of war between the keepers and the more selective sorters, as well as between those who would impose more order and those who encourage people to browse. The book captains, of course, have the final decision.
