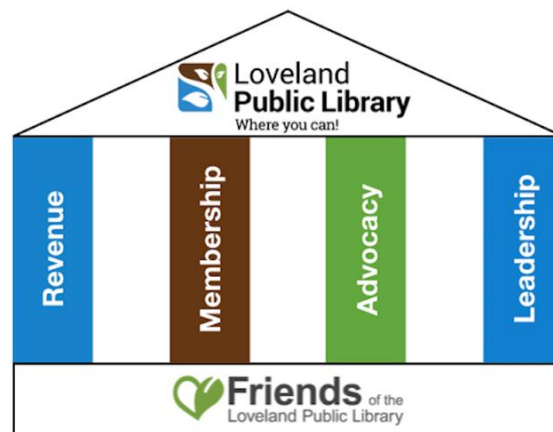

Committee Reports

Art in the Galleria

This joint effort among the Friends, the Loveland Public Library Board, and the Library staff provides an opportunity for Colorado artists to exhibit their work, thus serving to raise awareness of Loveland's vibrant arts community among library visitors.

Throughout 2022, members of the Art Selection Committee met to install the four quarterly shows in the Galleria. Additionally, the Committee conversed in July to plan the call for new art, open Aug.-Oct. via the Call for Entry website, and met in early December to select artwork for 2023. Library employees worked with the Committee and the City of Loveland legal department to offer contracts to the artists who display in the first-fourth quarters of each year.

All selected artists are featured in a print brochure as well as on the library website and are given the opportunity to sell their displayed artwork. Towards the end of 2022, the library staff streamlined the brochure process and hopes that the 2023 brochures will be both beautiful and more logistically manageable for the library staff. In 2022, five displayed pieces were purchased by patrons in the community with 20% of the proceeds donated back to the Friends. Additionally, a lovely oil valued at \$1000.00—*Quietude*—was generously donated to the Loveland Public Library by artist Julia Bright.

In 2022, 17 artists and their 55 pieces of art competed for the best of show award. Best of Show for 2022 went to sculptor Charlotte Szynskie in recognition of her balanced and emotionally powerful bronze, *The Tempest*. Susan Kadlec, Library Board member, graciously funded the prize of \$100.00.

Book Sales

Sales of donated books are our main source of income. These activities promote literacy in the community, and by generating more than half of our annual revenue, provide funding for most of the programming offered by the library.

This year we generated over \$98,000 revenue from the sale of used books! Both our 2022 Spring and Fall used book sales were very successful and attracted large crowds of eager shoppers.



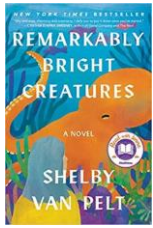
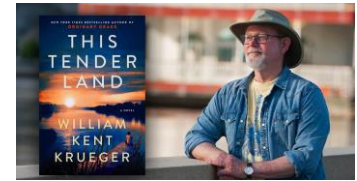
Our Chapter Two bookstore continues to be a popular place for library visitors to stop by and browse, and a consistent source of income for the Friends. Earlier this year we discontinued Chapter Two Online, which was created in 2020 to better serve customers who preferred not to visit the store in person, as those sales have tapered off.



We took a break from our eBay store this year, but plan to re-establish this type of online sales for some of our more valuable vintage and collectible items in 2023.

Loveland Loves to Read

Loveland Loves to Read committee hosted an author event with William Kent Krueger in April of 2022. We met our expectations on attendance and covered our expenses, and even turned a profit.

Loveland Poet Laureate



The Loveland Poet Laureate program had a busy and successful 2022. In April, for National Poetry Month, our programs were in the Devereaux Room. On April 1, we presented three readers—Juan Morales, Jacqueline St. Joan, and Autumn Bernhardt. On April 2, Juan Morales offered a workshop. On April 5th, at the Loveland City Council meeting, Lynn Kincanon was proclaimed our new Loveland Poet Laureate. On April 27th, our first Loveland poet Laureate Veronica Patterson gave her final reading at the Loveland Museum.

We held a successful high school poetry contest titled "Connect/Disconnect." We had a well-attended combined reading with the winning students on the same evening as the new Loveland Poet Laureate, Lynn Kincanon, was celebrated and read from her work.

We offered poetry readings in our Third Thursday series along with seasonal Sunday afternoon community programs, both in the Loveland Museum and on Zoom. The seasonal readings include an open mic and featured readers. We had two reading/workshop combinations: both were full and successful. We took part in the art/poetry offerings at the Loveland Museum honoring two exhibits which featured the works of Jim Disney. The poems in response to his art were compiled in a booklet titled *Inspired by the Artist*.

In collaboration with the Library, we resumed workshops titled "Encountering a Poet" (the first, offered in February 2020, was put on pause due to Covid). The two held so far this year have been successful, with up to 30 people in each workshop. They will be held four times a year. Daniel Tate has created podcasts featuring the workshop instructor. Along with Jeanette Edwards of the Library, we have begun an open microphone at the Artisans Kitchen in downtown Loveland on the last Friday evening of each month from 7 pm to 9 pm.

We have begun work with the Loveland Classical School, meeting with the school's literary club, and we hope to do more with them in the future. We're planning another high school poetry contest for 2023. We have been applying for grants to help with our funding endeavors. We are also collaborating with the Visual Arts Commission (VAC) and the Art in Public Places (TAPP) program to present poetry written in response to art works that will hang in the library in 2023.

Donations Webpage Committee

This year the board formed a temporary committee with the objective of better publicizing honor, memorial, and legacy donation opportunities with the Friends – one of our strategic goals. A lot of thought and effort was put into making our website’s “Donate” page more comprehensive and visually appealing. Business Sponsor Committee

Another board strategic goal was addressed by forming a temporary committee to create a structure for Friends business sponsors. This program offers three levels of sponsorship with varying benefits. A new webpage for Business Sponsors was added to our site, and a letter describing the program was sent to about 40 downtown Loveland small businesses. Sorting Place Search

Vandalism resulting in a major plumbing problem, along with the knowledge that the city will not invest in repairs or improvements to the Sorting Place, resulted in the formation of a search committee to find a new facility. An exhaustive search of commercial real estate yielded no leads, so the committee is now negotiating with the city to find a way to continue using the current Sorting Place building.

Volunteers

We depend on our volunteers for everything we do. You help with book sorting, our Chapter Two bookstore, online book sales, in-person book sales, public relations, library advocacy, our member database, the Friends website, board and committee work, and so much more. Your enthusiasm, dedication, and hard work make it possible to provide the library with funds to support various classes, equipment, and programs for the community.

In 2022, over 200 Friends volunteers contributed an amazing 10,693 hours! Thanks to everyone who pitched in and made 2022 such a successful year!



Library Director's Report

After two years of COVID, the Loveland Public Library began planning our future for this changed world. The staff knew people were craving connection to each other. The Friends of the Loveland Public Library's funding helped us create those connections.

One of our largest programs that the Friends helped support was our Summer Learning Program (SLP). After two years of virtual programming and takeaway kits, this year's SLP started with a bang, with a huge kick-off event. We helped people connect not only with the Library, but with many of the different city departments. These included Parks and Recreation, Pulse Broadband, and Water and Power. This kick-off created momentum that was seen throughout the program. We had over 4500 people register for the program. This year the Children's department had the highest finishing rate ever.

Over 36% of the kids completed the program. A cross departmental team comprised of Children's, Teens, Adults, and Library Technology gave out over 1800 prizes, the majority of which were purchased through the Friends' support. Families enjoyed outdoor story times, *Hobbies in a Half Hour*, and *LocoMotion: The Science of Circus Arts*. Teens visited the Hearts and Horses Therapeutic Riding Centered, created glass work at Artisan You, and enjoyed movies made from their favorite books. Adults set their own reading goals. All ages learned new skills through makerspace and digital learning activities. People made new connections throughout the community.

While the Summer Learning Program seemed like an old friend, the Library sought to do something new to explore the Latino culture in Loveland. We had previously celebrated this through our Dias de Muertos program in November. This year, we wanted to honor Hispanic Heritage Month. The Library worked with our longtime community partner, Heart & Sol, to create a new event.

The Latine Heritage Celebration kicked off Hispanic Heritage Month on September 17 with a large outdoor gathering at the Foote Lagoon. This featured musicians, dancers, guest speakers, plus vendors and food booths. The Friends funding paid for a Mariachi band and a Latin jazz band plus 300 sugar skulls. The community enjoyed

the opportunity to experience the diversity of Latino culture. The Library received very positive feedback for helping to organize and sponsor the event.

Many people were thrilled with these great in-person events. Others weren't ready to return to them. They were still looking for the opportunity to connect with others. People found this connection with the Library's podcast Libcast. With the Friends' support, the Library launched this in 2021. In 2022, with continued support, the podcast grew exponentially. Forty-two episodes were published with over 2200 episodes downloaded. Libcast has connected people to the Library, the community, and a variety of ideas. Teens discussed books they were reading. People fondly remembered past Cherry Pie Festivals. We highlighted the Salvation Army bell ringing and the opportunities provided by Larimer County Workforce. One of the great successes was the LOVEland Cookbook Group. This programming features a monthly podcast with former Snooze recipe developer Ashlee Redger and takeaway kits featuring a highlighted recipe.

Financial Report

In 2022, our operational income budget was fulfilled. In total, our used book sales and Chapter Two bookstore exceeded our budget targets. General donations and membership also increased and exceeded our targets.

Our expense budget was underspent despite meeting all the needs of the Library programs as well as our organizational costs. These savings, while not intended, served to offset much of the investment loss incurred by our reserve fund investments.

The 2023 budget adopted by the Board provides for all Library program requests as well as the anticipated operational costs. These costs are increasing consistent with the broader economy, but we foresee being able to cover them without tapping reserves. The need for a new sorting place is an ongoing priority for the Board. If a change were required in 2023, reserve funds would be employed.
