The Friends of the Loveland Public Library Spring Used Book Sale will be held **April 26-27** in the Thomas M. McKee 4-H Building at "The Ranch" Larimer County Fairgrounds and Events Complex, Interstate 25 and Crossroads Blvd., exit 259 in Loveland. The Members Only Preview Sale is Friday, **April 25** from 4-8 p.m.

No Price Increase this Sale!

Although our rental fees at the Ranch have increased significantly this year, we have decided to keep our prices the same for now. We expect to have over 55,000 books in 58+ categories, along with music CDs, DVD movies, books on CD and other non-book items. Prices range from 50¢ to \$1 for children's books, \$1-\$2.50 for teen and adult books. Our Vintage, Treasures and Collectibles books will be priced separately.

Children 12 years of age and younger attending the sale will be able to select a free book of their choice from the Children's Area.

As part of our "Going Green" effort, we ask patrons to bring their own paper, cloth, reusable shopping bags and boxes. On Sunday for the \$5 Bag Sale, prices for these containers will be determined according to what a standard plastic grocery bag holds.

The 4-H Building has its own gravel parking lot, with handicapped parking on the

asphalt in front of the building. Patrons will be able to pull close to the building to load their purchases. Parking is free.

Library News Ask Colorado

The Loveland Public Library has been working hard to bring new services to you. In December, the Loveland Public Library joined libraries across Colorado to offer virtual reference through AskColorado. AskColorado is a reference service that uses a virtual chat to answer questions. People can ask a variety of questions from student research to the value of a car. You can access AskColorado from the links located on the library's websites (lovelandpubliclibrary.org).

Once you pose your question, a live librarian greets you and chats with you to



answer your questions. AskColorado is staffed by a variety of librarians throughout Colorado so they may not be able to answer questions about your library account or when a certain book is due. The great thing about this service is that it is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week excluding major holidays. Need last minute help with that research project or information to settle a bar bet? Try AskColorado.

Nooks

The Nooks have arrived! With assistance from the Friends of the Library, the Library is now offering Nooks for checkout to patrons. We have a wide variety of Nooks to try. For adults, we have 10 Nooks; each has a specific type of book loaded on them. These types include: best sellers, literary fiction, mystery and thrillers, non-fiction, and science fiction. There are 20 to 25 titles on

each Nook. Nooks are available for children and teens too. An adult over the age of 18 must check out the Nook. Patrons can check out one Nook per library card for three weeks at a time. You can find the titles on each Nook by searching for Nooks in the library online catalog. Nooks are perfect for people who want to try an e-reader before purchasing, families who might need a little extra for a long trip, or people who want to take a whole library home in a small package. Check one out today.



New Microfilm Readers

For your viewing pleasure, we recently received two new microfilm microfiche readers for the Local History & Genealogy room. The new machines allow you to overcome common obstacles to reading old newspapers - great news for reading the Loveland Register in 1895! Images can be adjusted using available photo editing tools and can be combined, printed and emailed to yourself or someone else. The machines also contain other tools including annotation software for making notes or adding labels. Prospector Coming

If all goes as planned, the library will be offering access to Prospector by the end of April. Prospector is a collective online catalog of over 40 public and academic libraries in Colorado and Wyoming,. This catalog includes over 12 million books, CDs, DVDs, audiobooks and more. Many of the items can be requested and sent to the Loveland Library for you faster than the traditional interlibrary loan system we have had. Researchers and voracious readers will soon be panning for the gold in other Colorado libraries and patrons around the state will see the treasures the Loveland Library has to offer.

April 1 & 2 – Empire of the Sun, by J. G. Ballard. "Shanghai, 1941 – In streets full of chaos and corpses, a young British boy searches in vain for his parents. Imprisoned in a Japanese concentration camp, he is witness to the fierce white flash of Nagasaki, as the bomb bellows the end of the war...and the dawn of a blighted world. Ballard's semiautobiographical novel of war and

deprivation, internment camps and death marches, is an honest comingof-age tale set in a world thrown utterly out of joint." (Amazon.com)

May 6 & 7 – Out of Africa, by Isak Dinesen. With classic simplicity and a painter's feeling for atmosphere and detail, Isak Dinesen tells of the years she spent from 1914 to 1931 managing a coffee plantation in Kenya. "First published in 1937, Out of Africa is not free of the colonial or racist attitudes of its time; yet, within that context, Isak Dinesen is an enlightened observer and participant as she describes the experience of British East Africa before World War II." (Barnesandnoble.com)

The Library owns several copies of both books, and both titles are preloaded on the three "Bestseller Nooks" that are now part of the Library's circulating collection.


Fizz, Boom, Read is the children's theme and the program kicks off **June 2** with special activities from 2-6 p.m. Details and more information will be available in May.
