

**April 3 & 4** bring us a bit of timely social satire, laced with acid humor: *The Mandibles: A Family 2029 – 2047*, by Lionel Shriver. Having defaulted on its debts, the U.S. government prints money to cover its bills and the economy spirals toward disaster. The once-wealthy Mandibles must learn to cope and do so with varying degrees of success. Their future rides on the luck, greed, kindness and the inventiveness of the family's youngest member, a teenager named Willing.

On **May 1 & 2**, *Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End* by Atul Gawande presents the ultimate challenge of the medical profession: how to deal with the process of dying in a fulfilling, humane manner. The author-doctor presents a deeply considered combination of research and personal experience.

- The Library of Congress, founded in 1800, is the largest library in the world, with more than 155 million items on approximately 838 miles of bookshelves.
- Famous librarians throughout history include Mao Zedong, Golda Meir, Laura Bush, Marcel Proust, Lewis Carroll, Casanova, and Jorge Luis Borges.

The National Library Week 2018 celebration marks the 60th anniversary of the first event, sponsored in 1958 when research showed that Americans were spending less on books and more on radios, televisions and musical instruments. With the cooperation of American Library Association, the first National Library Week was observed with the theme "Wake Up and Read!"

#### **National Poetry Month**

Established in 1996 by the Academy of American Poets, National Poetry Month is the largest literary celebration in the world. Celebrate locally with programs at the Library as well as at the Loveland Museum and Gallery. The Library will offer Poetry Reading: *Everyday Raptures* with Lisa Zimmerman on Friday, **April 6** at 7 p.m. On Saturday, **April 7** at 9:30 a.m. there will be a workshop *Odes, Elegies, and Raptures, Oh My!* presented by Lisa Zimmerman. Teens will celebrate International Haiku Poetry Day on Tuesday, **April 17** at 5 p.m.

Loveland National Poetry Month events are sponsored by the Northern Colorado Chapter of the Columbine Poets, the Metaphors, the Writing Lab, and the Friends of the Loveland Library.

#### **Money Smart Week**



Money Smart Week was started in 2001 to help consumers learn to better manage their personal finances. The week features presentations by community groups, financial institutions, government agencies, educational organizations, and financial experts. The Library's presentations are at 6 p.m.:

- •Monday, April 23, Climb out of Debt. It is not about how much you make, it is how much you save!
- •Tuesday, **April 23**, *Buying or Refinancing a Home*. Curious about home mortgages or refinancing an existing mortgage? This session will cover everything from checking your credit to being handed the keys.
- •Wednesday, **April 25**, *Cashing in on Social Security*. Discover the different techniques to increasing your benefits while getting the inside scoop on how Social Security is determined and when to file.
- •Thursday, **April 26**, *Options on Medicare*. Whether you are already enrolled or just starting, this informative session will help you learn more about the four parts to Medicare, Supplemental Insurance, and more.

Look for new art in the Library Galleria beginning **April 2**. The Library is pleased to show only Colorado artists in its galleria showcases.




## Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Lecture and Discussion Series with Dr. George Stevens

The series of programs on Martin Luther King, Jr. continues on Wednesday, **April 11** at 6 p.m. with a presentation by Dr. George Stevens of Loveland's Martin Luther King Committee. Dr. Stevens will share Dr. King's views of the Vietnam War at a time when our country was conflicted about the war. What were the human, political, economic and moral considerations he used to establish his position?

#### An Evening with a Storyteller

On **May 15** at 6:30 p.m., storyteller and photographer David Fanning will present *Tales of Adventure in the Galapagos Islands* at the Loveland Public Library. He will be joined by Carol Seemueller, science teacher. They will present an evening of wildlife, birds and adventure stories (including a murder!) from their 10-day cruise of the Galapagos Islands.



#### **Buzzwords Book Group**

The Library will be hosting its non-fiction book club, Buzzwords on the second Thursday of each month. Thursday, **April 12**, the discussion will center on *A First-Rate Madness* by Nassir Ghaemi. This New York Times bestseller is a myth-shattering exploration of the powerful connections between mental illness and leadership.

On Thursday, **May 10**, the book discussion will be *The Girl with the Lower Back Tattoo* by Amy Schumer. The author recalls stories from her past about her teenage years, her family, relationships and sex, and shares the experiences that have shaped who she is - a woman with the courage to bare her soul to stand up for what she believes in, all while making us laugh. All Buzzwords meetings are held at the Verboten Brewing Company at 6:30 p.m.

## Symphony! Music Presentation and Lecture Series

On Monday, **April 9** at 6:30 p.m., the Library Symphony series will look at Dvorak Symphony #8. This cheerful work adds piccolo and English horn to the usual instrumentation. The second movement brings to mind a calm summer day interrupted by a thunderstorm. This symphony will be performed by the Loveland Orchestra on April 27.

On Monday, **May 14** at 6:30 p.m., the discussion will focus on Beethoven's Symphony #9. This final work begins with drama and suspense and adds vocal soloists and chorus in the last movement singing the famous *Ode to Joy* theme.
