Loveland Loves to Read Book Discussions at the Library are Unique Events!

Have you read *The Work of Wolves* yet? Don't you feel the need to talk about it with someone?

To share your thoughts about a book you have read is to share your reflections on life and to gain new perspectives about time and culture. Please join us and our fantastic Book Discussions leader, Janice Benedict, on **October 4** at 9 a.m. & 6:30 p.m. and on **October 5** at 9 a.m. at the library for a lively discussion of this year's Loveland Loves to Read selection.

The themes in *The Work of Wolves* give us pause, time to reflect, and to share thoughts about rich and poor, young and old, use and abuse of power, generational responsibility, family history, revenge and greed, ranches and reservations. Next, weave into those themes the American Indian legends of The Goat Man and The Trickster Iktomi. Finally, toss in a little intrigue about star-crossed lovers for a deep and moving story set in a quiet reservation border town in South Dakota.

But you thought this book was a mystery!! Yes, it is. But no person gets killed. It's a mystery of what happens to starving horses owned by a greedy land baron.

The novel begins with strong character development of three young men who barely know each other, but their lives become intertwined with genuine care and purpose. As the three young men attempt to solve the mystery of the horses, they search out the wisdom of Ted Kills Many, a Lakota challenged in his family relationships.

Loveland Loves to Read Presents a Writing Workshop with Kent Meyers

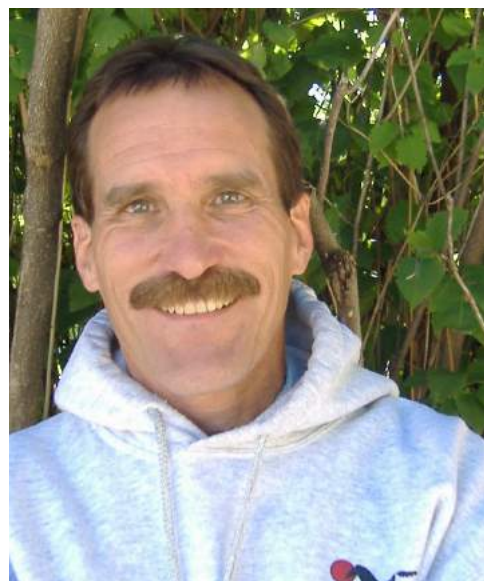

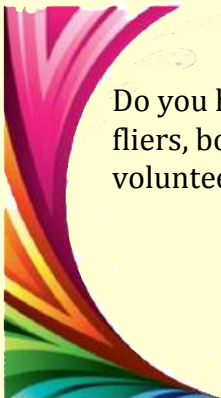

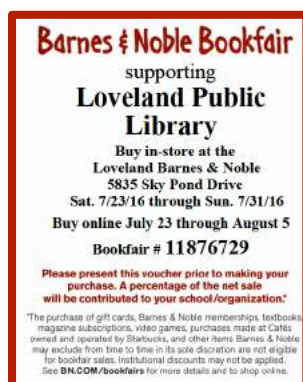

Staff Tech Day

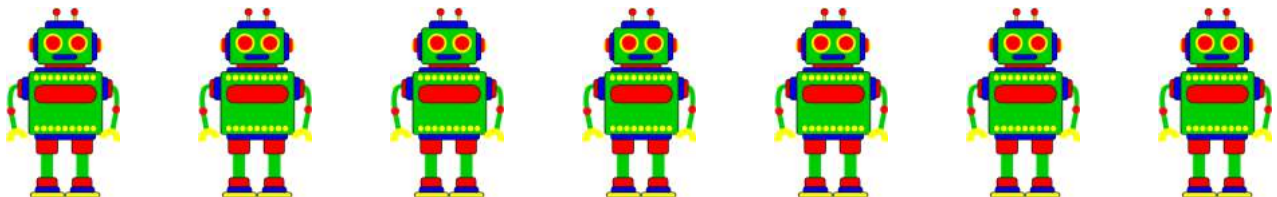
The library will be closed all day on Friday, **August 26** so staff can attend training on new technology.

Playgroup

Library Playgroup will restart after Labor Day, on Thursday, **September 8** from 10 -11 a.m. It is located in the Gertrude Scott Room and held on Mondays and Thursdays during the school year. It is for parents and caregivers and their children ages from infant to 5 years old. It is a casual playgroup that is free. Parents and caregivers are welcome to bring their children to enjoy books, music and toys in an informal setting.

Robots

A limited number of 8-11 year olds will be able to build a Library Robot on **August 8, 9 & 11** from 1 - 2:30 p.m. in the Gertrude Scott Room. Storytime Schedule Changes

Beginning in September there will be no Tuesday afternoon preschool storytime. Instead, we are adding a weekly Thursday preschool storytime (ages 3 and up) from 4:15 - 4:45 p.m.

More Than Storytime will happen once a month for a whole week: **September 27 - 30** including a Saturday 10 a.m. session on **October 1**. Our popular More Than Storytime consists of reading a book followed by activities set up around the room that coordinate with the theme. Play and Learn

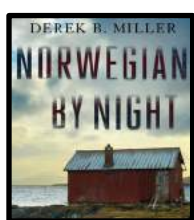
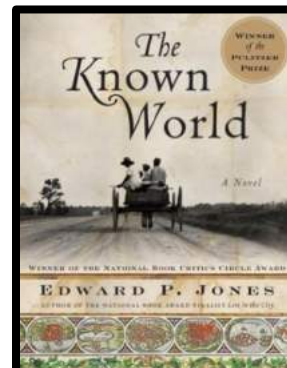


Symbiosis: Everything about finding people who share your passion. Sessions are at noon and 2 p.m. on **September 6**. The **September 7** session is at 6 p.m.

Adult Book Discussion Group

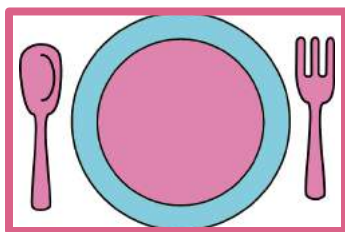
The Adult Book Discussion Groups meet on the first Tuesday of the month at 9 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. and on the following Wednesday at 9 a.m. The groups choose their reading from a ballot made up of their suggestions. The new schedule of their selections will be available at the August meetings and at the Adult Services desk after **August 3**.

Our title for **August 2 and 3** is *The Known World* by Pulitzer Prize winning author Edward P. Jones. *The Known World* tells the story of Henry Townsend, a black farmer and former slave who falls under the tutelage of William Robbins, the most powerful man in Manchester County, Virginia. But when death takes Townsend unexpectedly, his widow Caldonia can't uphold the estate's order and chaos ensues. Jones has woven a footnote of history into an epic that takes an unflinching look at slavery in all its moral complexities.



Tuesday, **August 16**, 6 p.m. will be the group's annual potluck dinner in the Gertrude Scott Room. The discussion book is *Norwegian By Night* by Derek Miller. The novel features a memorable hero and the last adventure of a man still trying to come to terms with the tragedies of his life. Compelling and sophisticated, it is both a chase through the woods thriller and an emotionally haunting novel about aging and regret.
