The Friends' Fall sale set a new record for record gross sales. We are grateful to all our volunteers, donors and patrons for that!

We displayed 54,000 books and rung up a total gross sales of \$34,089.62. Each book sale requires thousands of volunteer hours to sort piles of donated books, arrange the books on tables, work at the sale, and then tear it all down once again. A total of 1,312 volunteer hours at The Ranch and 2,695 hours at the Sorting Place over the past six months made this sale a huge success.

The Friends are proud that profits go directly toward exciting programs and new equipment at our wonderful library. Our profound thanks to everyone who contributed to making this sale one of our best ever! Our volunteers are already hard at work preparing for the next sale which will be held **April 20-22, 2018**. "Wandering Botanist in the Hawaiian Islands." On Tuesday, **December 12** at 12 noon, the Library's wandering botanist will talk about the fiftieth state. Hawaii is famous as a vacation destination and is the most remote landmass in the world. The Wandering Botanist will share the drama of Hawaii's volcanos, the history of colonization by plants, animals and people that has shaped a distinct culture. The islands are home to more endangered species than any other spot in the United States. The Library thanks the Friends of the Library for funding this popular program. Join the Library's tatting group to learn the lost art of tatting. Tatting is a technique for handcrafting a particularly durable lace constructed by a series of knots and loops, also known as "pearling" or "wrap weaving." Tatting can be used to make lace edging as well as doilies, collars, necklaces, bracelets and other decorative pieces. The tatting group meets every Wednesdays at 10 a.m. Every level of skill is welcome; no registration required.

The Wooly Knitters Group meets every Tuesday in December at 1 p.m. You can bring your own project or work on a class project.




Special Youth Programs
