

It's been the Friends' pleasure and honor to serve the Loveland community by providing this valuable information.

Today, we are both saddened and excited at the same time to report that this will be the last issue of *The Need to Know*. You'll notice that this issue is decidedly smaller than our previous issues because the *Library News* is not included.

For some time, both the Loveland Public Library staff and the Friends of the Loveland Public Library board members have been exploring how to provide the best quality information to patrons of the library and Friends' members, while putting precious Friends' resources to the best possible use.

The main priority of the Friends remains the funding of library programs, events and materials that support the library's mission to inform, enrich and inspire a strong, engaged community. As previously reported, Friends' expenses are projected to increase significantly in 2019 when we lose the use of the Sorting Place, where we gather and prepare used books for the spring and fall book sales. The city of Loveland has generously provided this space to the Friends for years but now has other plans for the property, thus necessitating the move. A committee is working to find a suitable space for the incredible work of the Sorting Place. This is vital since the book sales space is integral to the Friends' work since the book sales are the most profitable of our efforts that support the library.

Loveland Lights at the Library Celebrates the Holiday Season


