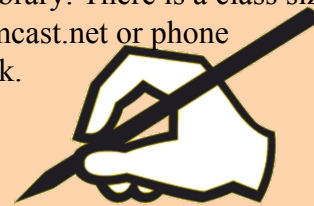

Patron Level Naming Contest Has a Winner!

Last June, the Friends' Board voted to change membership dues to ensure that they were simple to understand and affordable. We eliminated a few categories, and added four Patron Levels to make renewing memberships easier for those members who customarily include a donation with their membership. Soon after, we asked you for help in naming those patron levels and promised a prize to the winning submission. Seven of our members submitted interesting and clever ideas, which we carefully considered. It was difficult to choose, but we're happy to announce that Janice Benedict is our winner. Janice, being a great lover of books and very knowledgeable about authors, submitted a list of authors to choose from. Our patron levels are now called:

- John Steinbeck Level for a combined renewal and contribution of \$35
- Ernest Hemingway Level for a combined renewal contribution of \$50
- Willa Cather Level for a combined renewal contribution of \$75
- Mark Twain Level for a combined renewal contribution of \$100

Each of these membership levels is good for up to 4 people at same address.

Janice received a library book bag and a gift certificate for the book sale for her winning idea, which we presented at the Volunteer Appreciation Event on **September 17**. We want to thank her and all our members who submitted suggestions for the time and creativity that each gave to this project.

Reporting Volunteer Hours is Vital

If you've volunteered for Friends' events or ongoing activities, you know that we always ask you to record the number of hours spent. So, what do we do with that information?

Internally, we *want* it to understand what is happening and acknowledge the work people do. But, when we are applying for grants or listing our organization in public donation sites, we *need* the information. The Library staff regularly applies for grants to supplement their budget and the funds provided by Friends for programming. Grants frequently ask how many people a proposed program will benefit and what level of community support supports the library. The count of number of volunteers and number of hours volunteered is proof of support for Loveland Public Library. The completed volunteer time sheets prove the hours and people are real. We're sure we would seriously underestimate the number of people and volunteer hours without them. As an example, we recently applied to be part of the Colorado Gives Day program which required us to report community support.

But our volunteer records for 2015 had some gaps. Our dedicated member Sandy Luna (slnc12982@msn.com) records volunteer hours that are reported. With your help, Sandy will have much more complete totals when we update the Colorado Gives Day website information next year. So, keep track of your hours and turn them in, please!

Authors and Readers to Gather for the 2016 Loveland Public Library Local Author Showcase

On Saturday, **November 12**, the Loveland Public Library will be the site of a unique "double-header" for authors and readers alike! Over 100 local authors, both published and aspiring, will gather throughout the day, and in the afternoon hundreds of enthusiastic readers will cruise the Library Galleria to meet the published authors. The event is the *Second Annual Loveland Public Library Author Showcase*, and it promises to be an exciting event for both the authors and the readers of Northern Colorado.

The morning session, 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m., is entitled "Get Yourself Published: Learn from Experienced Professionals About Traditional Publishing and More," opens with a keynote address by successful Northern Colorado author, writing coach, and marketing consultant Teresa Funke (www.teresafunke.com).

The keynote will be followed by a panel discussion with local authors Carrie Visintainer (www.freeyourwild.com), Preethi Fernando (www.preethifernando.com), and Todd Mitchell (www.toddmitchellbooks.com), who all have taken different paths to successfully publish their works. During the morning session, eight lucky participants will be chosen by lottery to participate in an individual coaching session with Teresa that afternoon. 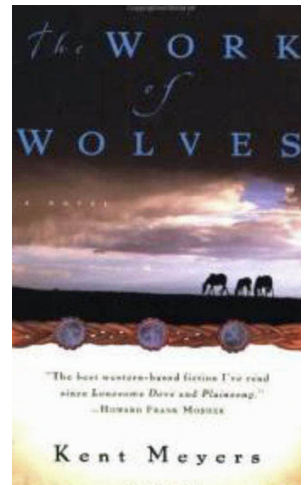

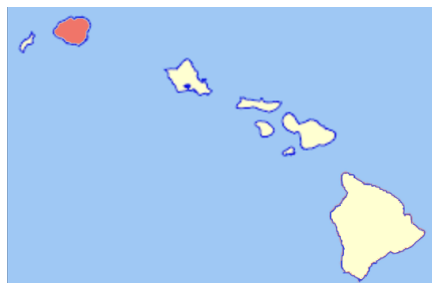
Holidays on the Cheap

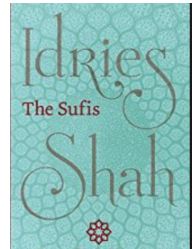
Nature Programs

Dreamwalkers

This BBC film, *The Dreamwalkers*, about how we learn and why we sometimes don't, will be part of a program commemorating the 20th anniversary of the death of Idries Shah, an author who became known for writing *The Sufis* in 1964.

That book was followed by more than twenty others, notably *Learning How to Learn*, *Wisdom of the Idiots* and *Thinkers of the East*. Many adults have remarked that Shah's books and other materials have helped them learn almost anything they choose to study. Shah's publications grow out of a centuries old tradition, mostly in the Middle East, sometimes referred to as Sufism. Many accomplishments, even in the West, both in the humanities and sciences, have their origins in this way of thinking.



Today, Sufis are often cited as an influence for peace in the Middle East. Sufis don't shy away from helping accelerate one's spiritual progress, regardless of formal religion. Sufis books for children will be on display, too. The program starts at 6:30 p.m., Tuesday, **November 22** in the Gertrude Scott Meeting Room.
